A Letter From Deacon James

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

Many of us are familiar with this Gospel passage from Matthew where Jesus appears to His disciples in Galilee after His Resurrection. And what is clear in this reading, "making disciples" is a matter of bringing the "lost" to salvation in Jesus Christ and helping them understand and obey His teachings. We know our call.

And how many times have we heard this statement, "Things just aren't what they used to be." We reminisce as to how life in the Church was and compare it to what life is all about now. Undoubtedly, generations of people have been doing the same. Many of us rightfully feel this concern. The idea of believing in God the Creator seems out of date. People now describe themselves as "spiritual," not religious. Where there is no true affiliation with the faith they were raised.

But that is okay! The call to make disciples of all nations is an outright challenge for us. We work to build the Kingdom by using our resources to continue to share the Good News as we disciples are called. We can only imagine how difficult this activity has been over the thousands of years of discipleship. Social media was non-existent until recently. Without technology, Catholic-Christians over the years accepted the challenge of sharing our Faith through instruction and example.

Thankfully, we at the Foundation are equipped to take on this task - to help ensure the teachings of the Catholic Faith are passed on from generation to generation through the financial support from you, our community of donors. We continue to monitor giving trends both in the Diocese of Phoenix and nationwide, recognizing a significant reliance on contributions from the faithful aged 68-80, who are a major part of our donor base in the Diocese. This prompts us to reflect on whether the next generation will fill those shoes, or if we face a deeper issue. The economic strain of inflation and changing attitudes towards faith are pressing concerns.



There are two factors that make our call to discipleship different: 1) a decline of faith across our country, and 2) the increased costs of living amongst younger generations. These equally contribute to an uncertain future for our vital ministries, both here in the Diocese and in our nation. Trends in the Catholic Church continue to point to a decreasing number of baptisms, confirmations, and marriages.

Without replacement of the faithful within our parishes, the concern is that this will continue to create uncertainty amongst our ministries and their ability to garner future support to provide the critical ministries we enjoy today.

This is not gloom and doom. This is the environment we will face in the future. However, with all the issues we face, there is always hope. This is one of the primary purposes the Foundation exists to secure the future of these critical ministries through end-of-life planning amongst our most faithful supporters, while beginning the education of endowments and their value in securing against the biggest area of concern: uncertainty.

The immediate need is always present. Jesus Himself said the "poor will always be with us." But this new challenge of financially sustaining our Faith has a future focus that will help offset the financial pressure of meeting the immediate need.

The Catholic Community Foundation has been focused on this reality for over 40 years. Will you help by answering the call to make "disciples of all nations"?

Donor Advised Funds

In the realm of charitable giving, finding taxefficient methods that align with our values is crucial. Donor-Advised Funds (DAFs) offer a powerful solution, allowing donors to make charitable contributions, receive immediate tax benefits, and recommend grants from the fund over time. However, for the Catholic community, the choice of DAF provider is of paramount importance, as secular providers may invest in companies or support causes that conflict with Catholic values. This is where our authentically Catholic Donor-Advised Funds distinguishes itself, ensuring that all investments and grants are consistent with our faith's teachings on the sanctity of life and other moral principles.

Why Use a Donor-Advised Fund?

DAFs serve as a strategic vehicle for philanthropy, offering several benefits:

<u>Tax Efficiency</u>: Donors receive immediate tax deductions in the year they contribute to their DAF, with the ability to spread out grants to charities over multiple years. A key strategy called "cluster giving" allows for one of the best tax planning opportunities.
<u>Flexibility</u>: DAFs allow donors to recommend grants to their favorite charities at their convenience, without the administrative burdens of direct giving (i.e., anonymity, multiple charitable receipts, tracking of donation status, etc.).

• <u>Legacy planning</u>: A DAF can be a tool for families to plan their philanthropic legacy, involving multiple generations in the decisionmaking process.

The Catholic Difference

Catholic Donor-Advised Funds ensure that your charitable giving aligns with your values in two crucial ways:

1) <u>Investments</u>: Unlike secular funds, Catholic DAFs invest solely in entities that adhere to Catholic moral and social teachings, avoiding companies that support practices contrary to our faith, such as, but not limited to, stem cell research, gender issues, and utilizing forced or child labor.

2) <u>Grant Recommendations</u>: Catholic DAFs scrutinize grant recommendations to ensure they support causes consistent with Catholic values, reducing the risk of inadvertently supporting activities that undermine our beliefs.
