

STATE OF THE SCHOOL 2021-2022 Celebrating Sr. Raphael's Half Century of Leadership and Compassion

The 2021-2022 school year brought an extraordinary milestone for our esteemed Principal, Sr. Raphael Quinn. The celebration of 50 years as the Principal of SS. Simon & Jude School! A milestone as significant as this was cause for celebration. Though a bit problematic with Covid as part of our daily lives, we managed to enjoy the school year to its fullest.

We began the year with Sister Raphael's favorite people – her students (all wearing their special "50 Years with Sr. Raphael" tees) – and a Mass of the Holy Spirit with Bishop Olmsted on August 25 in our school gymnasium. It was a socially-distanced, livestreamed Mass with all of us wearing masks, but nonetheless we were pleased to be together to celebrate the impressive leadership of Sr. Raphael. It was a very celebratory day with treats for all the students, plus a gift for each student delivered personally by Sr. Raphael to the classrooms. The Catholic Sun wrote a lovely article about Sister Raphael, and the year was off to a beautiful start.

September 29 was Sr. Raphael's Feast Day, and we had our Annual Giving Day on her feast day this year. Alumni parents, Chris and Susan Snodgrass, graciously provided \$50,000 in the way of a match for this special Giving Day, and what a day it was for our community. Our alums and their parents along with our school families stepped up to make sure we were able to double our goal and WE DID It was a miraculous day for us, and we were IT! overwhelmed by the success of the day. The entire \$100,000 was used to make a principal reduction on our loan for the Mary Ward Center. We are now at 70% repayment of the loan with just \$700,000 remaining until we are debt-free. It is Sr. Raphael's hope to have the loan repaid within the next 5 years, so she is extremely thankful to the hundreds of families who have helped us throughout this very long journey to make our school campus one of the most beautiful in the Diocese. Our 68-year-old school is now well positioned to reach the century mark thanks to the generosity of so many of you.

In October, after a two-year absence, our Fall Festival, under the leadership of school parents Mark and Lori Gonzales, returned with great energy as well as great attendance. The spirit on that day was one of warmth and hospitality and the welcoming feeling was felt throughout our campus. Also, after a very long absence, our Alumni Mass returned which was extremely special. We're already looking forward to next year!

Advent is a beautiful time here at the school with our annual Christmas Pageant presented by our 8th graders along with many other class programs and celebrations, as well as our annual St. Nick's Workshop. Though still plagued with the restrictions that come with Covid, we did our best to make the season special for our students.

Another colorful Jog-a-Thon was held on November 12 and we had beautiful weather and a fantastic time helping to raise money for the school. Tuition alone does not cover the cost to educate each student, so we supplement with various fundraisers throughout the year. Kinder through 8th grade students all ran on our baseball fields while listening to their favorite songs, courtesy of boys PE teacher Adam Kennedy (a/k/a "DJ AK"). It was a fun event for all, and we were pleased to have successfully met our fundraising goal!

On February 4th our students attended a special Mass with Fr. John Nahrgang where they each received a miraculous medal at the end of Mass from their teacher with the special blessing "I entrust you to Jesus through the loving hands of Mary." Our students understand how Mary is ready to pray for us, assist us and protect us, and they proudly wore their miraculous medals throughout the remainder of the school year.

We made the decision to move our auction out one month from Feb. 26th to March 26th which was a wise decision, especially since it was Sr. Raphael's birthday. With 300 in attendance we raised over \$110,000 in trying times – an incredible feat that would not have been possible without our "Pink Ladies" - Nikki Calhoun, Jeni Garcia and Alisa (Continued on page 4)

Forever in our Hearts Sr. Augustine Dempsey, 1.3.0.91

Sister Augustine Dempsey IBVM (Mary Patricia) died peacefully on Saturday, April 30, 2022 surrounded by her Loreto Sisters at Ss. Simon and Jude Convent.

In Ireland, after her Religious Profession, Sister Augustine taught in Loreto High Schools in County Cork for 37 years. When she first came to the U.S. she was missioned in New Orleans, Louisiana. She was one of the founding members of St. Benilde School in New Orleans, serving as a teacher, and thereafter as principal, before coming to Flagstaff, Arizona,

where she gave service in varied ministries, including: hospital chaplaincy, Holy Communion to residents at care facilities and to the homebound, ministry of prayer at funerals and graveside services, spiritual mentoring and service with prayer groups and with The Guadalupanas, service with St. Vincent de Paul Society, and assistance at the Family Food Center.

Upon retiring from all her apostolates in Flagstaff, Sister Augustine came to live with her Loreto Sisters at our convent here at SS. Simon & Jude but she did continue to give service by tutoring individual students from our school, and, for a time, serving as Spiritual Advisor with the parish-based St. Vincent de Paul group. She was also involved with the Potter's Field Ministry – the burial of the indigent poor with dignity and prayer.

Sister Augustine held an M.A. degree in Education, as well as a Guidance Counselor Certificate. She taught, guided, and mentored students, not just in their formative years, but in the advancing stages of their lives when they sought her advice and counseling. As one former student put it: "She has been my guardian angel, my teacher, my advisor, and my dear friend."

We also had a performance from our junior high students, a teacher/staff dance routine, and a beautiful video that was prepared by alum Wayne Dickmann featuring Sister's reflections on the past 50 years. At the luncheon, alumni parent Kathy Pidgeon announced the establishment of the Sister Raphael Quinn Principal's Scholarship. The Pidgeon and Collins families, two longtime SSJ families, are providing the initial deposits for this scholarship which we hope will be matched over the next year. The goal is to raise an additional \$50,000 so that the scholarship will become endowed. Endowed scholarships continue in perpetuity, meaning that this scholarship will be in existence FOREVER.



The end of the year is always bittersweet as we say farewell to our 8th graders. Our 49 graduates are off to local area high schools after an unusual couple of years. They will be missed, but never forgotten, and we hope they will continue to stay in touch with us in the years ahead. (see article on the accomplishments of this year's graduates on page 5.)
